#### A. Briefly summarize the Measurable Goal identified in the SWMPP in this reporting period.

The Village's Construction Site Storm Water Runoff Control program will provide equivalent protection to the NYSDEC SPDES General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Construction Activity. This includes reviewing SWPPs submitted to the Village for projects disturbing an acre or greater of land. 	The Village provides education on the proper disposal of dog waste. The Village Code specifically requires dog waste in any public place, beach or street to be cleaned up and

disposed of immediately. The Village Code also prohibits the disposal of pet waste in storm drains or in any manner that would allow the waste to enter any storm runoff or water body.

The Village evaluates the occurrence and/or compliance with the dog waste laws as a measure of SWMP effectiveness. For example, the Village monitors the citations for not properly disposing of dog waste, which are rarely issued.

11a. Is the goose population an issue in the MS4 areas? If the goose population is not an issue please describe, in the box below, the reasoning behind this viewpoint.

While some geese have been occasionally observed on Village properties, the deer population is of greater concern in the Village.

11b. If the geese are a problem, where has it been found to be a problem? Provide a description of the location or a map showing the areas of high population density of geese.

Resident Canada geese are known to favor open water and large grassy areas. These types of areas do not exist within the Village's Penniman Creek sewershed, which is primarily residential neighborhoods. Deer populations are prevalent throughout the Village.

11c. What strategies are in place to manage the population of geese on municipal properties?

Given that deer are a greater concern within the Village, the Village has implemented a culling program that allows the hunting of deer on residential land.

11d. What measurable indicators are being used to help determine the effectiveness of these strategies?

Accidents between deer and vehicles have decreased since the implementation of the culling program.
