Upon motion made by Kimberley Payne, seconded by Sally Beatty and unanimously carried, it was RESOVED, that a Special Event permit application from Jeffrey McKibben for use of the Village Beach parking lot only on July 16, 2022 from 6 P.M until 10 P.M. is approved.

Mayor Treuhold stated that the Village's Procurement Policy will be reviewed at the July board meeting.

There was a discussion of the Special Event that was held at the Village Beach on July 1, 2022. The police and fire departments responded to a call regarding an injury. It was discussed that the applicant (DellaCava) may be denied any future permits because of the incident.

There was a discussion regarding the concession at the beach not opening on time over the weekend because the Quogue Market is short staffed. Ryan Fay was assured by the operator of the Quogue Market that this would not happen again.

Trustee Cardo asked for an update on the boat ramp project. Trustee Payne will reach out to Ron Barnish of South Shore Docks, Inc. to get an estimated timeline.

Trustee Necarsulmer stated that the Fire Department should have the new truck by the end of August.

With no other business to discuss and upon motion made by Kimberley Payne seconded by Ted Necarsulmer and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned at 10:15 A.M.
