Upon motion made by Sally Beatty, seconded by Tom Mullen and unanimously carried, it was RESOLVED that an increase in A8710200 Stormwater Runoff & Bioswale Project and A3089 Other Govt Aid in the amount of \$43,500, to be funded from the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds previously received by the Village, is approved.

Upon motion made by Tom Mullen, seconded by Sally Beatty and unanimously carried, it was RESOLVED that a reimbursement to the Quogue Club at Hallock House for the Village's share of the cost of repaving the area on Quogue Street in front of the Quogue Club, including the restriping of the crosswalk across from Quogue Street, in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 is approved.

Resolution in Support of Continued and Increased State Aid for Local Governments

Upon motion made by Sally Beatty, seconded by Tom Mullen and unanimously carried, it was RESOLVED

Whereas, until 2024, cities, villages and towns had not received an increase in unrestricted state aid (AIM funding) in 15 years, significantly impacting their ability to provide essential services to their residents; and

Whereas, after a prolonged period without financial support, local governments finally received an increase of \$50 million in unrestricted state aid; and

Whereas, local officials express their gratitude for the \$50 million increase in unrestricted state aid, recognizing it as a positive step towards addressing long-standing funding challenges; and

Whereas, the State has referred to this new aid as Temporary Municipal Assistance, suggesting that such increase may not continue, jeopardizing the sustainability of crucial municipal programs and services; and

Whereas, the property tax cap further limits the ability of local governments to properly fund the programs and services their residents need; and

Whereas, increased and ongoing state aid for local governments is vital for maintaining infrastructure, public safety, housing and other municipal services; and

Whereas, the challenges of inflation, the increasing costs of labor and supplies, and the end of extraordinary federal aid only accentuate the need for consistent and predictable funding to effectively plan for the future and meet the growing needs of their residents;

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Village of Quogue calls upon the Governor and the State Legislature to commit to continuing the additional \$50 million in unrestricted state aid in the 2025-26 State Budget and beyond, and

Be it further resolved, that the Village of Quogue urges state officials to recognize the need for a longterm plan that ensures consistent and predictable increases in financial support for local governments that keep pace with inflation.

Resolution to schedule a public hearing on a local law amending Article V (Fences, Walls and Bulkheads) of Chapter 196 (Zoning) of the Village Code

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Village of Quogue hereby directs that a public hearing shall be held on Friday, December 20, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. prevailing time, at the Village Hall, Jessup Avenue, Quogue, New York, to hear any and all persons either for or against a local law entitled: "A Local Law amending Article V (Fences, Walls and Bulkheads) of Chapter 196 (Zoning) of the Village Code to authorize exceptions to the height limitations for non-residential districts, railroad screening, sports courts, septic systems, outdoor storage and utilities, temporary garden fences and deer fences." AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to refer this local law to the Suffolk County Planning Commission; and

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the following Notice of Public Hearing:
