PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY UNDER §24 OF ARTICLE 2-B OF NYS EXECUTIVE LAW

Pursuant to New York State Executive Law §24, a State of Emergency is hereby declared in the Village of Quogue for a period of time beginning at **3:00 p.m.** on the date of August 20, 2025, and continuing in effect for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days, unless sooner rescinded or extended.

This State of Emergency has been declared due to emergency conditions that are anticipated to be produced by the indirect effects of Hurricane Erin passing offshore of Long Island. The National Weather Service has issued warnings due to life threatening rip currents and an expectation of ocean swells and crashing beach surf, which is currently predicted to be 12-16 feet in height during the worst period of the storm. Beach and dune erosion is expected to occur as a result of the significant wave action. Coastal flooding in low-lying and vulnerable areas is also predicted to occur. Such conditions threaten and/or imperil the public safety of the citizens of the Village of Quogue due to forecasted weather conditions and the possible impacts to the coastal portions of our community.

As Mayor of the Village of Quogue, I, Robert Treuhold, have exercised my authority under New York State Executive Law §24, to ensure that all necessary and available assistance from the Village of Quogue may be rendered in furtherance of the health, safety, and well-being of everyone residing and working in our community.

I hereby direct all Quogue Village departments, agencies, and divisions, including, but not limited to, the Fire, Police, and Highway Departments, to take whatever steps necessary to protect life, property, and public infrastructure, and to perform other emergency assistance as deemed necessary.
